
Reading Tips


On the 1st day of Grinchmas the Grinch and Cindy-Lou went to get a





On the 3rd day of Grinchmas






On the 5th day of Grinchmas

the Grinch and Cindy-Lou went down to Who-ville to sing Christmas carols. Grinch moaned about the noise and put his hands over his ears...







On the 8th day of Grinchmas


the Grinch and Cindy-Lou played out in the snow.



On the 12th day of Grinchmas the Grinch and Cindy-Lou wrapped their presents and put them under the Christmas tree.


They couldn't wait to give them to their friends on Christmas Day, because they knew the very best thing about Christmas was being together.
